Chairperson's Report

The executive committee continues to provide support to the 1st Berryfields Scout Group to enable them to focus on the preparation and running of the beavers, cubs and scout sections.

Naturally 2020/2021 continued to be very different, and we are obviously grateful that scouting continues to offer opportunities to our young people. Nationally the Scout Association has had to make some very difficult decisions and we have seen a number of assets in England having to be sold to maintain a positive financial health.

We at 1st Berryfields Group have maintained all three of our section thanks to the support of our leaders who have adapted to the changing circumstances and continue to share the values of scouting. We are thrilled that the cubs were able to go to camp last summer after many weeks of yes/no due to the pandemic. Unfortunately winter saw the group having to cancel a beaver sleepover. However, this spring has finally seen us being able to return to full scouting, with no restrictions.

With the growing waiting list, I urge parents and guardians to reach out to your leaders to provide support and possibly take up leadership roles.

Scouting exists to actively engage and support young people in their personal development, empowering them to make a positive contribution to society.

The Executive Team

We operate under the Scout Association as a charity, where the trustees of the 1st Berryfields Scout Group exec committee are appointed annually at the AGM.

At Beavers since returning to face-to-face April 2021, Beavers have consistently had 24 children attending. We have achieved so many badges in the past year. However, our biggest achievement is 10 Beavers achieving the Chief Scout Bronze Award and moving onto Cubs.

Within our meetings we have achieved a number of badges as a colony, here are a few:

Health and Fitness - last summer we covered these elements, drawing healthy food plates and playing fun games and learning about how fitness and healthy eating fit into our lifestyles.

Space - this badge is always fun and our Beavers enjoyed learning the planets.

Experiment badge - we had an evening of multiple experiments for the Beavers to investigate.

Money Badge - this was achieved over 3 sessions and the Beavers really interacted with the marshmallow experiment, whereby they have to decide what to do with their marshmallow (money), eat straight away or save to see if their earn interest.

In September 2021 we had 6 Beavers join the District Camp at Braidwood, with the theme of seascape these Beavers enjoyed crafts, games, a night walk and campfire songs with marshmallows. We introduced the 'show and tell' element during quarter 1, 2022 and this allowed Beavers to bring in a hobby or collection to tell the colony about and achieve the relevant badge.

Moving forward, we are looking to cover the following badges:

Scouts have had amazing fun-packed year of adventure! Over 200 badges have been awarded, with 1st Berryfields Scout section's huge achievement of two Chief Scout's Gold awards (Kit and Melody)! We are also extremely proud of the 2 Scouts who attended the World Scout Jamboree selection weekend camp and were selected to attend the International Camp at Harlem in 2023.

There are currently 27 Scouts, (up by 2 on 2019 report) all of which attend regularly, we have a diversity of needs within the group and are currently managing well.

The Scout team consist of Stephen Hansen (aka: Hammer) and Daniel Nicklin (aka: Grizzly) as Scout leader and Dave and Sarah Tutton (aka: Fozzie and Bramwell) as Assistant Scout Leader. Therefore, the Scout leadership team is now a strong, proactive team of four, thus allowing us to continue to accept new Scouts when they apply for a place. Alongside this we have 2 young leaders Joel and Kit and a Senior Patrol Lead Scout Callum. The dynamics of the team work very well, and each and every leader is having a positive impact on the Scouts.

Throughout the past year the Scout section has been packed with activities and events, with many more approaching now that Covid restrictions have been lifted.

The Scout section has not yet managed a camp post Covid, but have attended "the Monopoly Run Live' in London with 3 amazing teams of Scouts (15 Scouts in total with 3 Leaders and a Young Leader). We had great placings overall and a really fun day. Our first camp of the year is in less than 2 weeks, this is called 'Strategy', where the Scouts will work in teams to work out a strategy to score as many points as they can completing challenges around the 3000 acre site at Cirencester Park.

The Scouts have completed a number of hikes this year, including getting involved in JOTT alongside the Cubs and the Beavers at 1st Berryfields Scout group.

The Scouts have contributed to the community by attending the Remembrance Parade in Aylesbury in November as well as the St Georges Day Parade in April, where we represented Berryfields by carrying the district Scout flag as well as our own. We had a good turn out at both of these events.

This year the program has been youth shaped, the Scouts have been given the opportunity to be involved in creating the program that they want, asking the Scout leadership team to create activities to help them learn and develop the skills for life that they want, this has been across the board of activities, skills, society and faiths. We have also had deep respectful conversations about the diversity of faiths, the role of women in society and gender identity.

This year the Scouts have worked on (to name a few):

- 1) Teamwork and Team Leader challenges
- 2) Problem solving and innovation (thinking on their feet)
- 3) Photography skills
- 4) Hikes away
- 5) Skills challenges (who can sew badges on and iron a necker?!)
