Group Scout Leader & Chairperson's Report

We would like to say a huge thank you to all our leaders, children's parents and our trustee team for ensuring that we have had wonderful opportunities and a great year scouting this past year.

The commitment from all our section leaders is huge it's not just an hour and half a week. It takes hours of planning behind the scenes and time away from family and friends often rearranging work patterns to ensure your children have a good experience while developing skills for life.

However the past year has thrown many challenges our way. We have a huge waiting list of children who would like to be scouts, the demand for scouting in Aylesbury has increased more than we could have ever imagined before covid, and parents are acutely aware of the importance of getting out and about.

We have over 80 children on our waiting list. Our challenge this coming year is to find more committed individuals who can become leaders, to enable us to grow and open second sections and possibly a new squirrel section if demand and capacity allows.

This past year has brought other challenges too, the lack of online banking and bank statements in the past has made it very difficult for our treasurer and section leaders to balance our books and it became evident very quickly, that we had many unpaid activities and outstanding subs, which has seen us take a hit financially. As a group, just like all our households, we have had seen an increase in rents, insurance as well as even Scout badges and scarves.

As a trustee team, we had to make some hard choices and the need to increase all subscriptions to £15 from April this year was not one that was taken lightly, however it was imperative to ensure that we were not operating at a loss.

We now have new bank accounts, this means we can see instantly if payments have been made before we commit the group in paying out for activities.

To that end the trustee team and treasurer have instructed that all subs must be up to date prior to any invitations to attend activity days or residential experiences. All payments are now made directly via OSM, this has transformed our accounting process. All our section leaders and treasurer now have instant access via OSM to view sections financial positions.

We will always endeavour to keep the costs of what we do as low as we possibly can, whilst remaining cost neutral to the group.

On a much lighter note we celebrate all our children's achievements in all their badges and all those who, despite coming out of COVID, have been able to complete their awards, congratulations one and all.

Throughout the last year, Beavers have consistently had 24 children attending and we plan for 3 parent helpers per week as standard. Our biggest achievement is 12 Beavers achieving their Chief Scout Bronze Award and moving onto Cubs.

Within our meetings we have achieved a number of badges as a colony, here are a few:

Sports - last summer we covered these elements over 6 weeks, we chose football to link in with the Women's Euros and Men's World Cup happening.

Hobbies – we continued with our show and tell for our Beavers to show us all their hoobies and answer some questions.

Experiment badge - we had an evening of multiple experiments for the Beavers to investigate.

Emergency Aid – We had Kimberley attend and run a session to cover this, all Beavers enjoyed learning how to bandage. **Disability Awareness** – linking pancake day to a presentation from a Beaver parent about us all being unique in our own way made for a delicious evening.

Global Issues – a highlight of this badge was doing a water experiment showing how different filter elements (cotton wool, grass, kitchen roll) work.

We took 18 Beavers to the Beaveree hosted by County at Paccar. Our Beavers took part in many adventurous and outdoor activities and we all had lots of fun.

We took 9 Beavers to the District Beaver Sleepover at Phasels Wood, we completed many outdoor activities including a night hike, singing round the camp fire, crafts, nature scavenger hunts, cresta run and low ropes. We took 5 Beavers to the County Beaver Sleepover at the National Space Centre, covering all elements of the space badge and learning through lots of fun activities.

We took 17 Beavers to the District Christmas Party, Colonel Custard was a blast and he pied one of our 1st Berryfields dad's and got pied by another 1st Berryfields dad!

We held our own 1st Berryfields Pirate Camp at Speen Scout Hut, we took 18 Beavers and had lots of fun! The weather was incredibly kind and we spent much of day 1 outside, with a major highlight being cooking on the camp fire and later in the evening signing and smores! Our Beavers enjoyed putting up tents and lots of crafting.

The representation of the Beavers at the Remembrance Sunday was great and St Georges Parade was good and we are incredibly proud of them.

We have many out of meeting activities planned this year: Thinktank Museum District day County Beaver Sleepover at Gullivers Christmas Party with Colonel Custard

Moving forward, we are looking to cover the following badges: Hobby & Collection badges – via show and tell Experiment Badge Explorer

Scouts have had amazing fun-packed year of adventure! 225 badges including one Chief Scout's Gold award, All Scouts are constantly working towards other Challenge badges, including some who are also very close to achieving their Chief Scouts Gold Award.

There are 37 young people with Berryfields Scout Section, 34 of which attend regularly, we have a diversity of needs within the group and are currently managing well.

We have a 1st for Berryfields Group... We have a new Assistant Scout Leader of Joel Hansen (aka: Monky)... Joel was a young person with Berryfields Scouts, Went to Matrix Explorers and thus four years later has come back to Berryfields as a leader!!

The Scout team now consist of 5 leaders, they are Stephen Hansen (aka: Hammer) and Daniel Nicklin (aka: Grizzly) as Scout leader, Dave Tutton (aka: Fozzie), Sarah Tutton (aka: Bramwell) and Joel Hansen (aka: Monky) as Assistant Scout Leader plus a young leader Theo (aka: Teddy). Therefore, the Scout leadership team is a strong, proactive family of six, we work well together, disturbing the work load between us well. The dynamics of the team work very well, and each and every leader is having a positive impact on the Scouts bringing different skills and knowledge to the table.

The Scouts have been active on camps with a total of 9 available nights away. Camps such as multi activity weekends where the Scouts could try 3G Gyro, Abseiling, Air-Rifle Shooting, Archery, Bungee Trampolining, Climbing, Crate Stacking, High Ropes, Ice Climbing, Land Zorbs, Slack Lining, Caving, Zip Wire.

Other camps have been multi activity inter scout competition; Strategy Camp, Gloucestershire, However a huge mention has to be said regarding 1st Berryfields and 12th Aylesbury group collaborating on a summer Survival Camp in Chalfont, Buckinghamshire and a indoor Winter camp at UK Scout HQ Gilwell Park in Chingford, London. At the Survival Camp there were 46 people on camp, 37 young people and 9 leaders from across the groups, we also had a visit from the Bucks Scout DC, The young people cooked their dinners on open fire, made jacket potatoes in a cardboard box over and roasted 9 whole chickens over a tindering fire pit for around 4 hours before tucking into the tastiest succulent chicken under the stars, The scouts also had multiple sessions to use knives, bow saw's and axe's, shelter building in the woods and most importantly time to just be young people and make new friendships away from technology.

The Scouts have completed a number of hikes in the past year, Such as the greenway, chip shop and the London Monopoly run (A live game of Monopoly in London!!) where they walked for around 25KM!! They have also contributed to the community via public parades within Aylesbury.

This year the program has been youth shaped, the Scouts have been given the opportunity to be involved in creating the program that they want, asking the Scout leadership team to create activities to help them learn and develop the skills for life that they want, this has been across the board of activities, skills, society and faiths. Three Tuesday nights have been 100% run by young people in the past year, they came to us, we helped the plan an evening, then allowed the young people to take control (of course we were in the wings supporting if needed).

This year the Scouts badges that have mainly been worked on are: Adventure, Athletics, Craft, Entertainer, Outdoors, Photographer, Fundraising, Musician

If you have a skill that you feel the Scouts would benefit from or would like to help and assistance with some events and evenings, be it formally or on an ad-hoc basis we look forward to hearing from you.
